Getting started:

1. What is your favorite courtroom drama?

Digging deeper:

Read Micah 6:1-8

1. In this trial scene, who is the accused? The prosecutor? Chief witnesses? Judge and jury?

2. What makes God's case against Israel so convincing [2-5]?

3. Under cross-examination, what does the accused have to say [6-8]? What does their silence imply? Are they guilty as charged?

4. Israel lists offerings and sacrifices with the hope that they will gain God's favor. What kinds of "offerings and sacrifices" do we think will appease the Lord?

5. Read Psalm 15. What requirements does David give for those who would enter God's presence?

6. In verse 8, Micah's call to *"love mercy"* speaks of loving God as unconditionally as He loves us and extending this kindness to others. Why is loving mercy so important in today's cancel culture?

1. Share a defining moment of God's faithfulness in your life—a moment you can look back on and know without doubt that God has been, is, and will always be with you.
